You can choose to participate in two ways. Once the app is downloaded and you have your location services turned on, choose your story and make your way to the start position. The app will register your position and the audio track for the story will run. (Headphones recommended if you want to avoid suspicious looks from other members of the public!) You can also choose to switch the audio off and simply read the text. As you follow the directions and approach your next position, the next part of the story will run. A map of where you are is also included.

Local authors have been carefully coached in how to make sure that the story is entertaining and includes the historical and current features of the area, often pointing out little know facts and sights as part of the story line.
